

I know this city from the ground up, inside out, and I have, along with the other founders of the project, made it my business to make sure everyone has a voice, from the city, to the library, to the schools, to churches, to development groups, to our arts organizations, parents, and children.

In a city looking to attract entrepreneurs, businesses and residents, I think I have the right mindset, and qualifications to be the interm mayor of Lakewood, Ohio.
